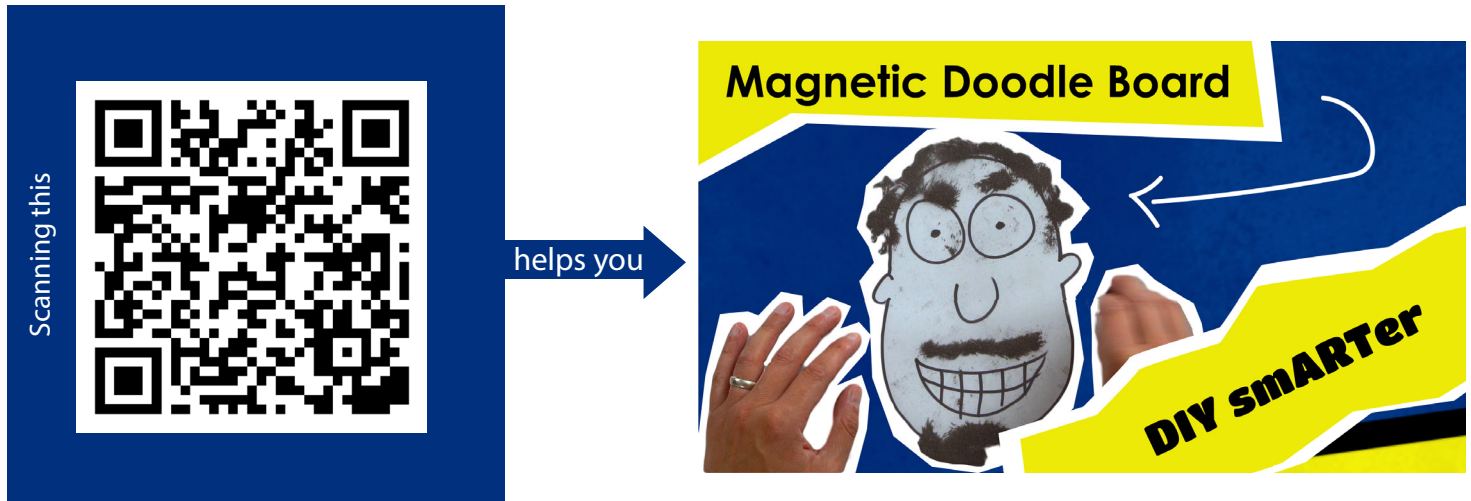


# Magnetic Art
