# **GRADES 4-5** EXTENSION ACTIVITIES



**Activity 1:** Fun with Figurative Language

(Appropriate for AFTER the Broadcast Lesson)

**Activity Goal:** Identify & interpret figurative language in context.

**Targeted Literacy Skills:** Identifying and interpreting figurative language.

Materials: Interpreting figurative language sheet (EReading) and a pencil.

### Steps:

- 1. Re-read the definitions of similes and metaphors (at the top of this website).
- 2. Read the figurative language phrases on the worksheet.
- 3. Identify if you observe a simile or metaphor. Write down your observations on the worksheet.
- 4. Explain what the figurative language is trying to say. Write it down on the worksheet.

**Activity 2:** Figurative Language Match-up! (Appropriate for AFTER the Broadcast Lesson)

**Activity Goal:** Matching figurative language to literal meanings.

**Targeted Literacy Skills:** Identifying and interpreting figurative language in context.

**Materials:** Any text (i.e. a book, newspaper article, poem, magazine article, and more), pencil, and paper.

## Steps:

- 1. Let's go on a figurative language hunt!
- 2. Read through a text and identify similes and metaphors used in the book.
- 3. Write down the similes and metaphors you identify in the book on a piece of paper.
- 4. Write what the figurative language means on a sheet of paper.
